### STATE OF MAINE.

### RESOLVE in favor of East Corinth Academy.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred dollars yearly, 2 for two years be and hereby is appropriated to East Corinth 3 Academy, an institution of learning, located in the town 4 of Corinth in the county of Penobscot: provided, however, 5 that the appropriation is made on the express condition 6 that the trustees of said institution shall maintain, and keep 7 in operation a school equal in rank and grade of teaching 8 with a first-class academy.



#### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

East Corinth Academy is an institution of learning fifty years old, and has done a grand good work for the state.

The academy building is old, but the trustees, aided by public-spirited citizens of the town of Corinth, have thus far kept the building in good repair and comfortable for the scholars attending the school, and thus far have never failed in any instance, to have at least a spring and fall term of school, in some years summer and winter terms also, oftentimes attended with an expense to the friends of the institution largely in excess of the receipts for tuition, which is the only source of income the academy has, except \$300 yearly from the state, for the last four years. We have nothing with which to pay for instruction and other expenses of the school, except what is paid by the scholars, and the \$300 above mentioned, which we think should be increased to \$500 yearly, in order to enable us to continue the school. The spring term has already commenced with sixty scholars.
