STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to prohibit the taking or killing certain Game Birds, for a term of years.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for a term of five 2 years to hunt for, take, catch, kill or destroy any of the 3 following named birds under a penalty of fifty dollars for 4 the offense, and twenty-five dollars for each bird so taken, 5 caught, killed or destroyed. The Capercailzie, or cock of 6 the woods, so called, black game, so called, or any species 7 of the pheasant.

SECT. 2. All fines and penalties under this act, shall 2 be enforced in the same manner, as for the violation of 3 laws relating to the illegal killing of game.
