STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT providing for the better regulation of the taking of fish in Wilson pond, otherwise known as Lake Auburn, in the city of Auburn.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. No fish of any kind shall be fished for or 2 taken in any manner from the tributaries of Wilson pond, 3 otherwise known as Lake Auburn, in the city of Auburn, 4 for the period of six years. Except that fish may be taken 5 for the purposes of propagation under the direction and 6 approval of the fishery commissioners. And for the purposes 7 of this act, all that part of the waters of said Lake Auburn 8 and Townsend brook, so called, as lie northerly of the 9 road leading from the Turner road, so called, to North 10 Auburn village, and crossing said Townsend brook, shall 11 be considered as tributary waters, and subject to the pro- 12 visions of this section.

- SECT. 2. No fish of any kind shall be fished for or taken 2 from said Lake Auburn from the first day of October in 3 each year until said lake shall be free from ice the following 4 spring, for the period of six years.
- SECT. 3. No fish of any kind shall be fished for or 2 taken from the waters of the said Lake Auburn from six 3 o'clock in the afternoon till five o'clock of the following 4 forenoon, of each day during the month of September of 5 each year, for the period of six years.
- SECT. 4. No fish of any kind shall be fished for or 2 taken from the waters of said Lake Auburn within one 3 hundred feet from the culvert at the mouth of said Town-4 send brook, during the month of September of each year 5 for the period of six years.
- SECT. 5. Any person violating the provisions of this 2 act shall be punished by a fine of five dollars for each 3 offence, and five dollars additional for each fish taken, to 4 be recovered by complaint before the municipal court of 5 the city of Auburn, one-half to the prosecutor and one-6 half to the city of Auburn.
- SECT. 6. Chapter 43 of the Private and Special Laws 2 of 1891, and chapter 565 of the Private and Special Laws 3 of 1893, are hereby repealed.
 - SECT. 7. This act shall take effect when approved.
