IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to amend chapter 250 of the Private and Special Laws of 1887, relating to taking of alewives in Bagaduce river and Walker's pond.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Section one of chapter two hundred and
- 2 fifty of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred
- 3 and eighty-seven is hereby amended by inserting after the
- 4 word "net" in the first line thereof the words 'and weirs,'
- 5 so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:
- Section 1. The taking of alewives, except by hand dip
- 7 net and weirs between Johnson's Narrows and the head of
- 8 Walker's or Gray's pond, so called, is hereby prohibited,

9 under a penalty of ten dollars for each fish so taken or 10 caught in violation of this act.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
