IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to prohibit the taking of fish from Cook's brook and Pearce's brook in Houlton, Aroostook County, for the term of four years.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

All persons are forbidden fishing for and taking any fish 2 from the waters of Cook's brook and its tributaries, or 3 Pearce's brook in Houlton in Aroostook county, Maine, 4 for the term of four (4) years from the first day of March, 5 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and 6 ninety-five. Any person who violates the provisions of 7 this act shall be punished by a fine not exceeding ten dol-8 lars, or in default thereof, by imprisonment of not less 9 than ten or more than thirty days. The fines and penalties

- 10 provided by this act may be recovered on complaint,
- 11 before any trial justice in Aroostook county.
