STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT for the better protection of fish in Three Mile pond, in China, Windsor and Vassalboro, in the county of Kennebec.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall be permitted to fish for or 2 take any pickerel by fishing through the ice, from Three 3 Mile pond in the towns of China, Windsor and Vassalboro 4 in the county of Kennebec, excepting on Saturdays of each 5 week, and then only for the purpose of conveying the same 6 to their homes for consumption. Provided further that 7 when fishing through the ice, lines shall not be allowed to 8 remain during the night.

SECT. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this 2 act, shall be liable to a fine of ten dollars for the offense, 3 and one dollar additional for every fish taken in violation 4 to be recovered on complaint before any trial justice in 5 Kennebec county, one half to the use of the camplainant, 6 and one half to the use of said county.
