STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to extend the charter of the Lewiston, Augusta and Camden Railroad Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. The time within which the Lewiston, 2 Augusta and Camden Railroad Company, a corporation 3 created by chapter 278 of the Private and Special Laws of 4 1891, as amended by chapter 626 of the Private and 5 Special Laws of 1893, may file its locations and commence 6 operations for building its lines, is hereby extended to July 7 1, 1897.

SECT. 2. Section 1 of said chapter 278 is hereby 2 amended by inserting in the fourteenth and sixteenth lines 3 of said section after the word "Camden," the words 'or 4 city of Rockland,' so that said section as amended shall 5 read as follows :

Section 1. Peleg O. Vickery, John W. Chase, Elias 7 Milliken, George E. Macomber, Horace H. Hamlin, M. 8 V. B. Chase, James W. North, William H. Williams and 9 Frank E. Southard, their successors, associates and assigns 10 are hereby made a body corporate, to be known as the 11 Augusta, Lewiston and Camden Railroad Company, with 12 power to locate, construct, keep in repair and equip a 13 railroad from some point in the city of Lewiston or of 14 Auburn, in the county of Androscoggin, pursuing the 15 most direct and feasible route through said city and the 16 towns of Webster, Wales, Bowdoin, Litchfield, West 17 Gardiner, Farmingdale, the cities of Gardiner, Hallowell 18 and Augusta and the towns of Windsor, China, Somer-19 ville, Palermo, Liberty, Appleton, Union, Hope, Wash-20 ington, Camden, and the city of Rockland, or such of said 21 cities and towns as the stockholders of said corporation 22 shall determine to a point in the said town of Camden or 23 city of Rockland on Penobscot bay, and said corporation 24 shall have all the powers, privileges and immunities and 25 be subject to all the duties and liabilities provided by the 26 statutes of this state applicable to railroads.'
