## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to amend Section one hundred and twenty-two of Chapter two hundred and sixty-six of the Public Laws of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, relating to the Militia.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section one hundred and twenty-two of

- 2 Chapter two hundred and sixty-six of the Public Laws of
- 3 one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, is amended
- 4 by striking out the word "twelfth" in the fourth line
- 5 thereof, and inserting in place thereof, the word 'tenth,'
- 6 so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 122. For the purpose of raising revenue to de8 fray the current expenses of the National Guard, there
9 shall be assessed and collected as other state taxes are, a
10 tax of one tenth of one mill upon all property in the state
11 subject to taxation, for the present fiscal year, and for
12 each fiscal year thereafter. The revenue raised under the
13 provisions of this section shall be paid into the state
14 treasury, and be converted into a special military fund,
15 from which special fund only shall be paid the expenses
16 authorized by this act; and so much thereof as may be
17 necessary, is hereby appropriated to carry out the pro18 visions hereof, to be paid upon vouchers approved as
19 provided in section one hundred and seven.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
