RESOLVE in favor of Ellen Goodwin.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the State treasury, 2 to Ellen Goodwin of Winthrop, a pension of six dollars 3 per month beginning January first, eighteen hundred and 4 ninety-five,



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Ellen Goodwin is the widow of Samuel Goodwin who served in the War of the Rebellion in the Signal Service and on the quota of Massachusetts. She has no property of any kind or nature except a few household goods. Mrs. Goodwin is sixty-four years of age, in feeble health, and her only means of support is a United States pension of eight dollars per month, and she is not able to obtain her living by manual labor.
