STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to amend Section two of Chapter six hundred and fifty-four of the Private and Special Laws of 1856, entitled "An Act to preserve the Harbor of Portland."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section two of chapter six hundred and fifty-four of the 2 Private and Special Laws of 1856 entitled "An Act to 3 preserve the harbor of Portland" is hereby amended by 4 striking out the whole of said section after the word 5 "south-easterly" in the first line, and substituting in place 6 thereof the following words, namely; 'between Portland 7 bridge and the break-water, beginning at a point marked 8 "A" on the "plan accompanying the report of the advisory

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9 council called by the commissioners on Portland harbor, 10 Maine, showing harbor lines in Fore river made in July, 11 1873," said point "A" being on the westerly side of Port-12 land bridge in line with the sea wall of the Dry Dock 13 Company's wall extended, from this point "A" the line 14 runs in a north-easterly direction making an angle to the 15 right from said Portland bridge of eighty-five degrees and 16 thirty-eight minutes ($85^\circ 38'$) a distance of five thousand 17 three hundred and thirty (5,330) feet to a point nearly 18 opposite the westerly end of the break-water; thence in a 19 more southerly direction about one thousand eight hun-20 dred and thirty feet (1,830) to the centre of the light-21 house at the easterly end of the break-water;' so that said 22 section as amended shall read as follows :

'Section 2. It is bounded southeasterly between Port-24 land bridge and the breakwater, beginning at a point 25 marked "A" on the "plan accompanying the report of the 26 advisory council called by the commissioners on Portland 27 harbor, Maine, showing harbor lines in Fore river made 28 in July, 1873," said point "A" being on the westerly side 29 of Portland bridge in line with the sea wall of the Dry 30 Dock Company's wall extended, from this point "A" the 31 line runs in a northeasterly direction making an angle to 32 the right from said Portland bridge of eighty-five degrees 33 and thirty-eight minutes (85° 38′) a distance of five thou-34 sand three hundred and thirty (5,330) feet to a point 35 nearly opposite the westerly end of the breakwater; 36 thence in a more southerly direction about one thousand 37 eight hundred and thirty (1,830, feet to the centre of the 38 lighthouse at the easterly end of said breakwater.'
