STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section three of chapter two hundred and
ninety-seven of the Public Laws of 1885, relating to the
sale of Unwholesome Food.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 3 of chapter 297 of the Public
2 Laws of 1885 is hereby amended by inserting in the third
3 line after the word "sell" the words 'or takes orders for
4 the future delivery of,' and in the fourth line after the
5 words "imitation of" the word 'yellow' and striking out
6 the words "or as a substitute for butter or cheese" in the

7 fourth and fifth lines, and by inserting after the word
8 “costs” in the eleventh line the words ‘one third to go to
9 the complainant and the balance to the state,’ so that the
10 whole section as amended shall read as follows :

‘Section 3. Whoever by himself or his agent manufac-
12 tures, sells, exposes for sale or has in his possession with
13 intent to sell, or takes orders for the future delivery of
14 any article, substance or compound made in imitation of
15 yellow butter or cheese, and not made exclusively and
16 wholly of cream or milk, or containing any fats, oil or
17 grease not produced from milk or cream, whether said
18 article, substance or compound be named oleomargarine,
19 butterine or otherwise named, forfeits for the first offence
20 one hundred dollars and for the second and each subse-
21 quent offence, two hundred dollars, to be recovered by
22 indictment with costs, one third part to go to the com-
23 plainant and the balance to the state.

And it shall be the duty of every inspector of milk,
25 sheriff, deputy sheriff and constable, as named in section
26 five of this chapter to institute complaint against any
27 person or persons violating the above named provisions of
28 said third section.’

SECT. 2. The provisions of this act shall not be con-
2 strued to affect any pending indictment for violation of
3 section 3 of chapter 297 of the Public Laws of 1885.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
