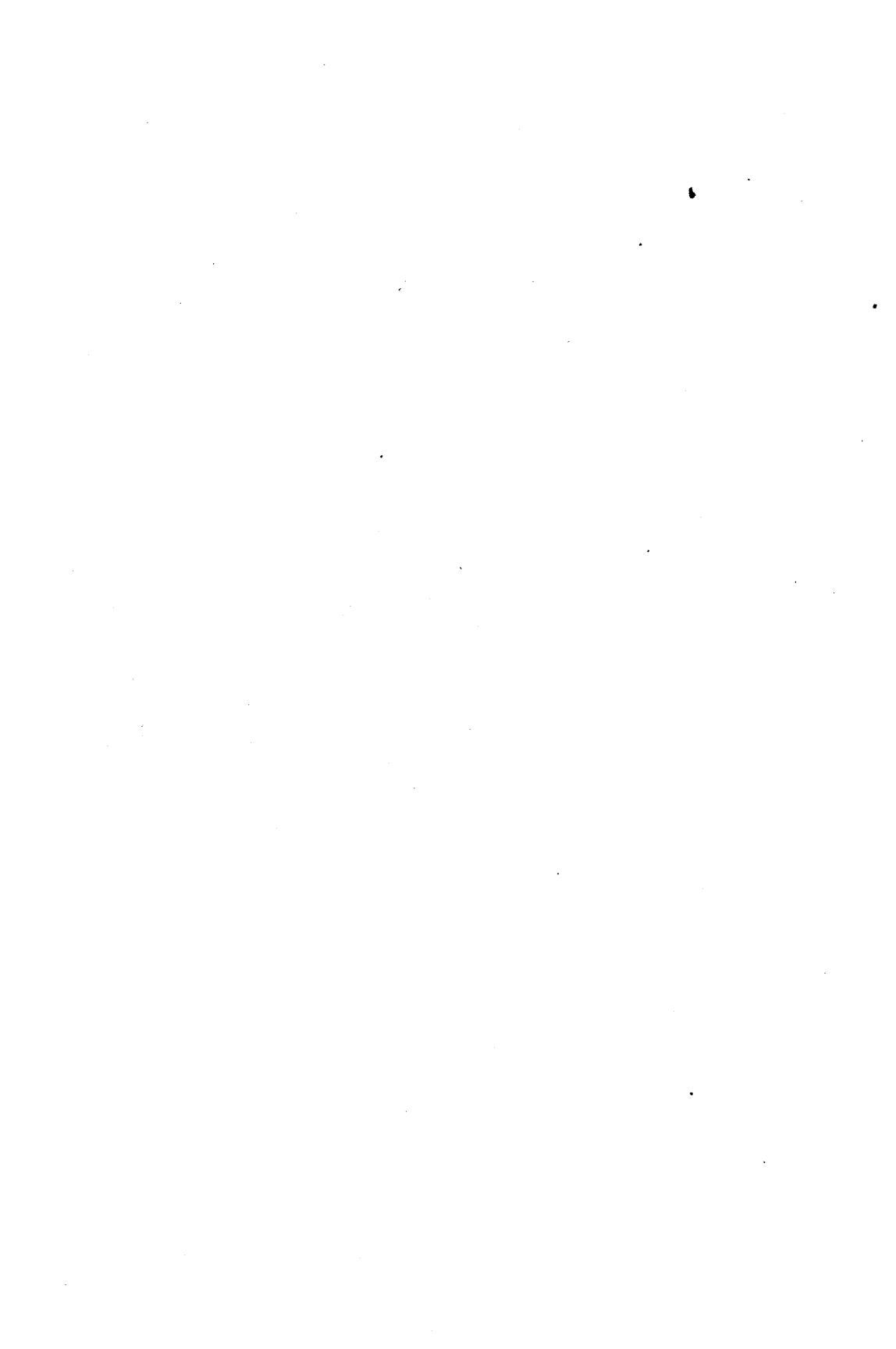
AN ACT relating to the Sebasticook and Moosehead Railroad
Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. The Sebasticook and Moosehead Railroad
2 Company, a corporation existing by law in this state, is
3 hereby authorized and empowered to extend its line of
4 railroads from Athens village in the town of Athens,
5 Maine, by a feasible route to some point or place at or
6 near Monson junction in the town of Abbott, Maine,
7 passing through the towns of Brighton, Wellington,
8 Kingsbury and Abbott, or any, either, or all of said towns,

9 and all the rights, powers, privileges, and immunities
10 which were given said corporation for the extension of its
11 line of railrord from Hartland to Athens by chapter one
12 hundred and seventy-one of the Private and Special Laws
13 of the State of Maine of the year eighteen hundred and
14 ninety-one, shall apply to the extension authorized by this
15 act, including the right to erect and maintain telegraph
16 and telephone lines.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said corporation, may, by
2 vote of its stockholders, be increased from time to time
3 to not exceeding five thousand shares of the par value of
4 fifty dollars each, and may issue its scrip, bonds, or other
5 negotiable promises to aid the purposes of its incorpora-
6 tion, and may secure the same, or any part thereof by
7 mortgage of its property and franchise. The work of
8 construction on the extension line authorized by this act
9 shall not begin later than May nineteen, in the year of our
10 Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.
