STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to amend chapter six hundred and thirty-four of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-three, relating to the Hampden and Winterport Electric Railway and Light Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter six hundred and 2 thirty-four, Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred 3 and ninety-three, is hereby amended by striking out the 4 words "Hampden and Winterport Electric Railway and 5 Light Company," in the seventh and eighth lines thereof, 6 and inserting in their place, 'Hampden and Winterport 7 Railway;' and further amended by inserting at the end of 8 the thirty-eighth line after the words "location thereof"

9 the following words, to wit: 'Said corporation is hereby 10 granted the right to run passenger and freight cars over 11 its said line and over the tracks of the Bangor Street 12 Railway, so far as it is necessary in order to deliver 13 passengers and freight in the vicinity of West Market 14 Square, Broad and Exchange streets in said Bangor, on 15 such rates of compensation and other terms as may be 16 agreed upon between said corporation and the Bangor 17 street railway; but in case said corporations are unable to 18 agree upon such rates of compensation or other terms, 19 then three disinterested persons shall be appointed by the 20 judge of the supreme court, on application of either party, 21 and a hearing shall be had before said commission. 22 commission shall be sworn, give notice of the time and 23 place of their meeting, to determine the matter in dispute, 24 and shall make to each party a written final decision of 25 the points submitted, and their services shall be paid in 26 equal proportions by the parties. The Bangor Street 27 Railway is hereby granted the right to run its cars over 28 the line and tracks of said Hampden and Winterport Rail-29 way, subject to the terms of arbitration herein provided; 30 provided always, that said Hampden and Winterport Rail-31 way shall not run its cars over the tracks of the Bangor 32 Street Railway, and the Bangor Street Railway shall not 33 run its cars over the tracks of the Hampden and Winter-34 port Railway, for the transportation of passengers, other 35 than upon terms mutually agreed upon by said companies, 36 or determined by arbitration, as herein provided; so that 37 said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 1. J. Manchester Haynes and George E. 39 Macomber of Augusta, Kennebec county; Henry W.

40 Mayo of Hampden; Henry L. Mitchell and Eugene C. 41 Nichols of Bangor, in Penobscot county; Fred Atwood of 42 Winterport, in the county of Waldo; and H. L. Shep-43 herd of Rockport, in the county of Knox; their associ-44 ates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted a cor-45 poration by the name of the Hampden and Winterport 46 Railway, with authority to construct, maintain and oper-47 ate by electricity or animal power, a street railway with 48 convenient single or double tracks, side tracks, switches 49 or turnouts, with all necessary or convenient lines of 50 poles, wires, appliances, appurtenances, conduts and elec-51 tric plants for motive power and lighting, in and through 52 the towns of Hampden, Winterport, Frankfort, Prospect 53 and Stockton Springs, upon streets and highways to be 54 located by the municipal officers of said respective towns, 55 after the right of way has been granted by the towns, and 56 assented to in writing by said corporation, build and main-57 tain bridges with draws across navigable tide waters in 58 each of said towns upon location and upon terms to be 59 established and made by the county commissioners of the 60 counties in which the bridge is located. Said corporation 61 shall have authority to construct electric light and power 62 plants and maintain and operate said railway upon and 63 over any lands where the land damages have been mutu-64 ally settled by said corporation and owners thereof; estab-65 lish and locate electric lights upon streets, furnish lights 66 to individuals and collect pay for the same; provided, 67 however, that all tracks of said railway shall be laid at 68 such distances from the sidewalks of said towns as the 69 respective municipal officers thereof shall in their order 70 fixing the routes of said railway determine to be for

71 the public safety and convenience. The written assent 72 of said corporation to any vote of said towns or of the 73 municipal officers of said towns, prescribing from time to 74 time the routes of said railway, shall be filed with the 75 respective clerks of said towns, and the assent to the loca-76 tion of bridges by county commissioners to be filed with 77 the clerk of courts, shall be taken and deemed to be the 78 location thereof. Said corporation is hereby granted the 79 right to run passenger and freight cars over its said line 80 and over the tracks of the Bangor Street Railway, so far 81 as it is necessary in order to deliver passengers and freight 82 in the vicinity of West Market Square, Broad and Ex-83 change streets in said Bangor, on such rates of compensa-84 tion and other terms as may be agreed upon between said 85 corporation and the Bangor Street Railway; but in case 86 said corporations are unable to agree upon such rates of 87 compensation or other terms, then three disinterested per-88 sons shall be appointed by the judge of the supreme 89 court, on application of either party, and a hearing shall 90 be had before said commission. Said commissioners shall 91 be sworn, give notice of the time and place of their meet-92 ing, to determine the matter in dispute, and shall make to 93 each party a written final decision of the points submitted, 94 and their services shall be paid in equal proportions by 95 the parties. The Bangor Street Railway is hereby granted 96 the right to run its cars over the line and tracks of said 97 Hampden and Winterport Railway subject to the terms of 93 arbitration herein provided; provided always, that said 99 Hampden and Winterport Railway shall not run its cars 100 over the tracks of the Bangor Street Railway, and the 101 Bangor Street Railway shall not run its cars over the

102 tracks of the Hampden and Winterport Railway, for the 103 transportation of passengers, other than upon terms mut-104 ually agreed upon by said companies, or determined by 105 arbitration as herein provided. Said corporation shall 106 have power from time to time to fix such rates of compen-107 sation for transporting persons or property as it may think 108 expedient, and generally shall have all the powers and be 109 subject to all the liabilities of corporations as set forth in 110 the forty-sixth chapter of the Revised Statutes.'
