STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section six of chapter one hundred and
seventy-three of the Private and Special Laws of 1883,
relating to the Superintending School Committee of the
city of Auburn.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. Section six of chapter one hundred and
2 seventy-three of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen
3 hundred and eighty-three is hereby amended by striking
4 out the words, "They shall annually and whenever there
5 is a vacancy elect a superintendent of schools for the
6 current municipal year, who shall have the care and super-
7 vision of said public schools, under their direction, and

8 act as secretary of the board," in lines six, seven, eight
9 and nine of said section, and by inserting in lieu thereof the
10 words, 'They shall annually, in the month of June, elect
11 a superintendent of schools, whose term of office shall begin
12 on the first day of July following, and who shall have the
13 care and supervision of said public schools under their
14 direction and act as secretary of their board; and they
15 may fill any vacancy in said office,' so that said section as
16 amended shall read as follows :

'Section 6. The said committee shall have all the powers
18 and perform all the duties in regard to the care and man-
19 agement of the public schools of said city, which are now
20 conferred and imposed upon superintending school com-
21 mittees by the laws of this state, except as otherwise pro-
22 vided in this act. They shall annually, in the month of
23 June, elect a superintendent of schools, whose term of
24 office shall begin on the first day of July following, and
25 who shall have the care and supervision of said public
26 schools under their direction, and act as secretary of their
27 board; and they may fill any vacancy in said office. They
28 shall fix his salary at the time of his election, which shall
29 not be increased during the year for which he is elected,
30 except by consent of said city council, and may at any
31 time dismiss him, if they deem it proper and expedient.
32 They shall annually, as soon after the organization of their
33 board as practicable, furnish to said city council an esti-
34 mate in detail of the several sums required during the

35 ensuing municipal year for the support of said public
36 schools, and shall not increase the salaries of the superin-
37 tendent and teachers or any other expenditures beyond
38 the amounts specified therefor in such estimate, except
39 by consent of said city council. No member of the com-
40 mittee shall receive any compensation for his services.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
