STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Canada road.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred dollars be and
2 is hereby appropriated to be expended in repairing that
3 part of the Canada road which is in Sandy Bay township,
4 said sum to be expended under the direction of the county
5 commissioners of Somerset county.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The road from Moose river, Somerset county, to the Canada line, has always been regarded a state road. Most of the way it runs through a wilderness, and in the township of Sandy Bay there are but two houses. The timber has been nearly all cut and the land is practically worthless. The road bed is over what is called the height of land, very hilly and springy; and since the building of the Canadian Pacific Railroad through that county said road is much traveled, with a large amount of heavy teaming. The tax which can be assessed on said land is not sufficient to keep it in decent condition; and, especially springs and falls, it is in horrible shape. It requires state aid to be safely traveled.
