STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE making appropriations for the Penobscot tribe of
Indians.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury to
2 the agent of the Penobscot tribe of Indians for the years
3 of 1895 and 1896 to be appropriated for the benefit of
4 said tribe each year as follows :

Forty-four hundred and twenty-nine dollars and seventy
6 cents, amount of interest on their trust fund held by the
7 state, for the benefit of said tribe ; seventeen hundred
8 dollars for their annual annuity each year ; six hundred
9 dollars for agricultural purposes each year ; two hundred
10 dollars for bounty on crops each year ; two hundred dol-
11 lars for salary of agent each year ; one hundred dollars to
12 pay a competent person to instruct and assist said Indians

13 in their agricultural labors each year; six hundred dol-
14 lars for schools each year, to be used in employing
15 competent teachers, namely: Four hundred and seventy-
16 five dollars for Old Town island, under the supervision of
17 the agent of said tribe and resident priest; one hundred
18 and twenty five dollars for Olamon island under the super-
19 vision of the superintending school committee of Green-
20 bush, and said committees are required to report as
21 directed in resolve approved March seventeenth 1860,
22 and it shall be the duty of said agent to see that the
23 money is fully expended for the education of the children
24 of said tribe; one hundred dollars for the salary of the said
25 priest each year, provided he says mass twenty-four
26 Sundays during the year for said tribe of Indians; fifty
27 dollars for the salary of governor each year; forty dol-
28 lars for salary of the lieutenant governor each year;
29 twenty-five dollars to procure a suitable stove for the
30 new school house on Old Town Indian island; one hun-
31 dred dollars to make certain needed repairs to the church
32 building on said island, all the foregoing sums to be
33 expended under the direction of the governor and council,
34 for the purposes for which they are appropriated, and for
35 and for none other, and any sums of money not expended
36 for the purpose for which it was appropriated, shall not
37 be allowed to said agent in the settlement of his account.
