STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Plantation of Lexington.

Resolved, That the state treasurer be directed to pay to
2 the treasurer of the plantation of Lexington the sum of four
3 hundred and forty-one dollars and sixty-six cents, being its
4 part of the school and mill fund tax of the years 1891 and
5 1892, and county tax for said years.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

By chapter 449 of the Public Laws of 1893 the legislature exempted the plantation of Lexington from the payment of state and county taxes and abated certain taxes thereon. By resolve of same legislature the state treasurer was afterward at said session by chapter 184 of the resolves of 1893 was directed to pay the plantation the sums then standing on the books of the state treasurer as its part of the school and mill fund tax for the years 1891 and 1892.

By an inadvertence in framing this bill the state treasurer could not legally pay their money as the former act passed first and there was nothing on the books.

This sum together with the county tax abated by the legislature at that session is equitably due the plantation and the legislature intended by the resolve above mentioned to pay said sum of \$345.44 as its part of the school fund for the years 1891 and 1892 together with the tax abated which was payable to the county of \$96.22, making a total of \$441.66, but yet by said resolve could not pay it as appears by the terms thereof.
