STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE making appropriations for the Passamaquoddy Tribe of Indians.

Resolved, That there be paid from the state treasury, to 2 be expended under the direction of the governor and 3 council to the agent of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indi-4 ans, for the benefit of said tribe, for the years 1895 and 5 1896 as follows: For May dividend four hundred dollars 6 each year; for November dividend four hundred dollars 7 each year; for distressed and contingent poor, three thou-8 sand five hundred dollars each year; for contingent pur-9 poses, one hundred and fifty dollars each year; for ploughing, 11 one hundred and fifty dollars each year; for salary of

12 governor, one hundred dollars each year; for salary of 13 lieutenant governor, forty dollars each year; for wood, 14 six hundred and fifty dollars each year; for dressing for 15 land, one hundred and fifty dollars each year; for educa-16 tional purposes, eight hundred dollars each year; for sal-17 ary of priests, two hundred dollars each year; for salary 18 of agent, two hundred dollars each year; for salary 18 of agent, two hundred dollars each year; for basket ash, 19 three hundred and fifty dollars each year; for agricultural 20 purposes, six hundred dollars each year; for police, 21 twenty dollars each year; repairs of Sisters' Home at 22 Point, one hundred dollars in 1895; repairs of road at 23 Point, one hundred dollars in 1896; school books each 24 year, thirty dollars.

All the foregoing sums to be expended under the direc-26 tion of the governor and council for the purposes for 27 which they are appropriated, and for none other, and any 28 sum of money not expended for the purposes for which it 29 is appropriated shall not be allowed to said agent in the 30 settlement of his account. •
