STATE OF MAINE.

**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE.**

AN ACT to amend special act of eighteen hundred and eighty, entitled "An Act to amend chapter ninety-one, section four of the laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-eight relating to the Marshal and Deputy Marshal of the City of Bath."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Chapter two hundred and ninety-one, section four of the 2 acts of eighteen hundred and eighty, are hereby amended 3 by striking out the words "Deputy Marshal" and also by 4 adding after the word "March" the words 'or as soon 5 thereafter as conveniently may be,' so that the section, as 6 amended shall read as follows:

‘Section 4. The city marshal of the city of Bath, shall
8 hereafter be annually elected in March, or as soon there-
9 after as conveniently may be, by the city council, and all
10 policemen, watchmen and constables shall hereafter be
11 annually appointed by the mayor, by and with the advice
12 and consent of the aldermen.
