STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to authorize Joseph H. Hezelton to navigate
Presumpscot River.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. Joseph H. Hezelton, of Westbrook, his
2 associates and assigns are hereby vested with the exclusive
3 right against all other persons and corporations of employ-
4 ing and navigating every kind of boat or water craft pro-
5 pelled by steam or electricity for hire or as common car-
6 riers of freight and passengers on the Presumpscot river
7 in the county of Cumberland, between Saccarappa Falls
8 and Madison Falls, for the term of six years from the
9 passage of this act.

SECT. 2. It shall be the duty of the said Hezelton, his
2 associates and assigns, to furnish reasonable accommoda-
3 tions for the transportation of freight and passengers upon
4 said river between the Falls aforesaid in the summer
5 season, and, if he shall fail to do so, for the period of one
6 month after reasonable notice, the exclusive right aforesaid
7 shall terminate.

SECT. 3. Whoever shall be guilty of a violation of the
2 exclusive rights hereby granted shall forfeit not less than
3 thirty dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for each
4 day or part of a day that such violation continues to be
5 recovered by and for the use of said Hezelton, his associ-
6 ates and assigns, in an action of debt.

SECT. 4. A reasonable toll is hereby authorized for the
2 transportation of freight and passengers upon said river
3 between the falls aforesaid.
