STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT amendatory of and additional to chapter forty of the Revised Statutes, relating to Fish and Fisheries.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section thirty-three of chapter forty of the 2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended so as to read as 3 follows:

'Section 33. The governor with the advice and consent 5 of the council, shall appoint three persons to be commis-6 sioners of inland fisheries and game, one of whom shall 7 be the land agent of the state, and who shall hold said 8 office so long as he shall remain land agent of the state, 9 and shall receive in addition to his present salary annu-10 ally, the sum of two hundred dollars, the other two 11 members shall hold their office for three years, and until 12 their successors are appointed and qualified, and shall 13 each receive an annual salary of one thousand dollars.

Said commissioners shall receive in addition to their 15 salary actual traveling expenses to be audited by the gov-16 ernor and council. The governor, with the advice and 17 consent of council, shall also appoint one other commis-18 sioner who shall have general supervision of the sea and 19 shore fisheries, and shell fish, regulated by this chapter, 20 and shall hold his office for three years and until his 21 successor is appointed and qualified, and shall receive the 22 same salary now provided for such office.

SECT. 2. Chapter forty of the Revised Statutes is hereby 2 further amended by adding thereto the following sections :

'Section 75. Said commissioners of inland fisheries 4 and game shall examine dams and all other obstructions 5 existing in all rivers and streams, and determine the neces-6 sity of fish ways, and the location, from and capacity 7 thereof; introduce and disseminate valuable species of food 8 fish into the inland waters of the state, and valuable food 9 birds into the state. They shall examine into the work-10 ings of the inland fish and game laws, see that all viola-11 tions thereof are duly prosecuted, and perform all other 12 duties prescribed by law. They shall report annually to 13 the governor, on or before the thirty-first day of Decem-14 ber, who shall cause three thousand copies to be printed.'

'Section 76. The commissioners of inland fisheries 16 and game shall have authority, upon petition of five or 17 more citizens of the state, or whenever they shall deem 18 it for the best interests of the state, after due notice and 19 public hearing in the locality to be affected, to regulate 20 the times and the places in which and the circumstances 21 under which game and inland fish may be taken; but they 22 cannot authorize the taking of game or inland fish at a 23 time in which so doing is prohibited by general law of the 24 state.'

'Section 77. When they deem it for the best interests 26 of the state, after like notice and hearing, they may 27 entirely prohibit the taking of any kind of game or inland 28 fish in any part of the state for a series of years not 29 exceeding four.'

'Section 78. They may adopt, and from time to time 31 modify or repeal, such needful rules and regulations, not 32 contrary to the general laws of the state, as they may 33 deem necessary or proper for the protection and preser-34 vation of the game and inland fish of the state, in con-35 formity with the provisions of section 76 and 77 of this 36 chapter.'

'Section 79. They shall file in the office of the clerks of 38 the cities, towns and plantations in the territory to be 39 affected a copy of the rules and regulations adopted by 40 them, and publish the same three weeks successively in a 41 newspaper printed in the county and post on the banks of 42 waters to be affected as near as may be like notices; and 43 whenever any such rules or regulations apply to any unor-44 ganized township, a like copy shall be filed with the clerk 45 of courts for that county and published three weeks suc-46 cessively in a newspaper printed in the county; they shall 47 also immediately upon the adoption of any rules and reg-48 ulations contemplated by this act file an attested copy of 49 the same in the office of the secretary of state.

'SECT. 80. Whoever fishes for, takes, catches, kills or 51 destroys any inland fish, in any manner or at any time, in

52 violation of any of the rules and regulations of the com-53 missioners of inland fisheries and game, made and pro-54 mulgated in conformity with the provisions of this chap-55 ter, shall be punished in the same manner and to the same 56 extent as is provided for by law for the illegal taking, 57 catching, killing or destroying any such inland fish.'

'SECT. 81. Whoever at any time or in any manner shall 59 hunt, chase, catch, kill, take, have in possession, or 60 destroy any inland game in violation of any of the rules 61 and regulations of the commissioners of inland fisheries 62 and game made and promulgated in conformity with the 63 provisions of this chapter, shall be punished in the same 64 manner and to the same extent as is provided for by law 65 for the illegal hunting, chasing, catching, killing, taking, 66 having in possession, or destroying any such inland game.'

'SECT. 82. Any person who wilfully mutilates, de-68 faces, or destroys any notice, rule or regulation of the 69 commissioners of inland fisheries and game, posted in 70 conformity with the provisions of this act, shall be pun-71 ished by a fine not exceeding fifty dollars, to be recovered 72 by complaint or indictment; one-half of said fine shall be 73 paid to the prosecutor.'

SECT. 3. Section 40 of chapter 40, and sections 15 and 2 16 of chapter 30 of the Revised Statutes and all amend-3 ments thereto are hereby repealed.

SECT. 4. The governor with the advice and consent of 2 council, upon the recommendation of the commissioners 3 of inland fisheries and game may appoint suitable persons 4 as fish and game wardens, who shall hold office for a term 5 of three years unless sooner removed; who shall enforce 6 all laws relating to inland game and fisheries, and rules 7 and regulations relating thereto, arrest all violators 8 thereof, and prosecute all offences against the same; they 9 shall have the same power to serve criminal processes 10 against such offenders, and shall be allowed the same fees 11 as sheriffs for like services; they shall have the same right 12 as sheriffs to require aid in executing the duties of their 13 office. They shall, before being qualified to discharge the 14 duties required by this act give bond with two good and 15 sufficient sureties in the penal sum of two thousand dol-16 lars approved by the commissioner of inland fisheries and 17 game to the treasurer of the state. Conditioned for the 18 faithful performance of the duties of their office.

SECT. 5. The governor, with the advice and consent 2 of council, upon the recommendation of the commis-3 sioner of sea and shore fisheries may appoint suitable 4 persons as fish wardens, who shall hold office for a term 5 of three years unless sooner removed, who shall enforce all 6 laws and the rules and regulations relating to sea and 7 shore fisheries, arrest all violators thereof, and prosecute 8 all offences against the same; they shall have the same 9 power to serve criminal processes against such offenders, 10 and shall be allowed the same fees as sheriffs for like ser-11 vices; they shall have the same right as sheriffs to require 12 aid in executing the duties of their office. They shall, 13 before being qualified to discharge the duties required by 14 this act give bond with two good and sufficient sureties in 15 the penal sum of two thousand dollars approved by the 16 commissioner of sea and shore fisheries, to the treasurer 17 of the state, conditioned for the faithful performance of 18 the duties of their office.

SECT. 6. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with 2 this act are hereby repealed.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT amendatory of and additional to chapter forty of the Revised Statutes, relating to Fish and Fisheries.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 33 of chapter 40 of the Revised 2 Statutes is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

'Section 33. The governor, with the advice and consent 4 of council, shall immediately upon the approval of this 5 act, appoint two persons, to be commissioners of inland 6 fisheries and game, who shall hold their office for three 7 years, and until their successors are appointed and quali-8 fied; they shall each receive a yearly salary of one thou-9 sand dollars. The land agent of the state shall also be a 10 commissioner of inland fisheries and game who shall

11 receive a yearly salary of two hundred dollars, in addition 12 to his salary as land agent. They shall receive, in addi-13 tion, their actual traveling expenses, to be audited by the 14 governor and council. The three commissioners aforesaid 15 shall act as a board. The governor, with the advice and 16 consent of council, shall also appoint one other commis-17 sioner, who shall have general supervision of the sea and 18 shore fisheries and shell fish regulated by this chapter, 19 and perform all other dutics prescribed by law. He shall 20 hold office for three years, unless sooner removed, and 21 shall receive the same salary now provided for such offices.'

SECT. 2. Chapter 40 of the Revised Statutes is hereby 2 further amended by adding thereto the following sections :

'Section 75. Said commissioners of inland fisheries 4 and Game shall examine dams and all other obstructions 5 existing in all rivers and streams, and determine the nec-6 essity of fish ways, and the location, form and capacity 7 thereof; introduce and disseminate valuable species of 8 food fish into the inland waters of the state. They shall 9 examine into the workings of the inland fish and game 10 laws, see that all violations thereof are duly prosecuted, 11 and perform all other duties prescribed by law. They 12 shall report annually all of their doings to the governor, 13 on or before the thirty-first day of December, who shall 14 cause three thousand copies to be printed.'

'Section 76. The commissioners of inland fisheries and 16 Game shall have authority, upon petition of five or more 17 citizens of the state, or whenever they shall deem it for 18 the best interest of the state, after due notice and public 19 hearing in the locality to be affected, to regulate the man-20 ner, conditions and circumstances under which game and 21 inland fish may be taken; but they cannot authorize the 22 taking of game or inland fish at a time in which so doing 23 is prohibited by general laws of the state.'

'Section 77. They may adopt, and from time to time 25 modify or repeal, such needful rules and regulations 26 respecting the manner, conditions and circumstances under 27 which inland fish and game may be taken, not contrary to 28 the general laws of the state, as they may deem necessary 29 or proper for the protection and preservation of the game 30 and inland fish of the state, in conformity with the provi-31 sions of section 76 of this chapter.'

Section 78. They shall file in the office of the clerks 33 of the cities, towns and plantations in the territory to be 34 affected a copy of the rules and regulations adopted by 35 them, applicable to such territory, and publish the same 36 three weeks successively in a newspaper printed in the 37 county and post on the banks of waters to be affected as 38 near as may be like notices; and whenever any such rules 39 or regulations apply to any unorganized township, a like 40 copy shall be filed with the clerk of courts of that county 41 and published three weeks successively in a newspaper 42 printed in the county; they shall also immediately upon 43 the adoption of any rules and regulations contemplated 44 by this act file an attested copy of the same in the office 45 of the secretary of state.

'Section 79. Whoever fishes for, takes, catches, kills 47 or destroys any inland fish, in any manner or at any time, 48 in violation of any of the rules and regulations of the 49 commissioners of inland fisheries and game, made and 50 promulgated in conformity with the provisions of this 51 chapter, shall be punished in the same manner and to the 52 same extent as is provided for by law for the illegal tak-53 ing, catching, killing or destroying any such inland fish.

'Section 80. Whoever at any time or in any manner 55 shall hunt, chase, catch, kill, take, have in possession or 56 destroy any inland game in violation of any of the rules 57 and regulations of the commissioners of inland fisheries 58 and game made and promulgated in conformity with the 59 provisions of this chapter, shall be punished in the same 60 manner and to the same extent as is provided for by law 61 for the illegal hunting, chasing, catching, killing, taking, 62 having in possession, or destroying any such game.'

'Section 81. Any person who wilfully mutilates, 64 defaces, or destroys any notice, rule or regulation of the 65 commissioners of inland fisheries and game, posted in 66 conformity with the provisions of this act, shall be 6 punished by a fine not exceeding fifty dollars, to be 68 recovered by complaint or indictment; one half of said 69 fine shall be paid to the prosecutor.'

•Section 82. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent 71 with this act are hereby repealed.'

SECT. 3. Section 40 of chapter 40, and sections 15 and 2 16 of chapter 30 of the Revised Statutes and all amend-3 ments thereto are hereby repealed.

SECT. 4. The governor with the advice and consent of 2 council, upon the recommendation of the commissioners 3 of inland sheries and game, may appoint suitable per-4 sons as fish and game wardens, who shall hold office 5 for a term of three years unless sooner removed; who 6 shall enforce all laws relating to inland game and fisheries, 7 and rules and regulations relating thereto, arrest all viola-8 tors thereof, and prosecute all offences against the same; 9 they shall have the same power to serve criminal pro-10 cesses against such offenders, and shall be allowed the 11 same fees as sheriffs for like services; they shall have the 12 same right as sheriffs to require aid in executing the 13 duties of their office. They shall before being qualified 14 to discharge the duties required by this act, give bond 15 with two good and sufficient sureties in the penal sum of 16 two thousand dollars, approved by the commissioner of 17 inland fisheries and game, to the treasurer of the state. 18 Conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties of 19 their office.

SECT. 5. The governor with the advice and consent of 2 council, upon the recommendation of the commissioner of 3 sea and shore fisheries may appoint suitable persons as 4 fish wardens, who shall hold office for a term of three 5 years unless sooner removed, who shall enforce all laws, 6 and the rules and regulations relating to sea and shore 7 fisheries, arrest all violators thereof, and prosecute all 8 offences against the same; they shall have the same power 9 to serve criminal processes against such offenders, and 10 shall be allowed the same fees as sheriffs for like services; 11 they shall have the same right as sheriffs to require aid in 12 executing the duties of their office. They shall before 13 being qualified to discharge the duties required by this act 14 give bond with two good and sufficient sureties in the 15 penal sum of two thousand dollars approved by the com-16 missioner of sea and shore fisheries, to the treasurer of 17 the state. Conditioned for the faithful performance of the 18 duties of their office.
