

STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE relating to indexing papers and records in the Land Office.

Whereas, The legislature of 1893 directed that the 2 plans and records in the land office should be properly 3 indexed, the work has been attended to as far as possible 4 with the means at command, but as there are no funds for 5 continuing the work therefore be it

Resolved, That the sum of six hundred dollars for the 7 year 1895, and six hundred dollars for the year 1896 be 8 appropriated for that purpose, to be expended under the 9 direction of the land agent.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

There are very many very valuable papers and records in the office to which the public is constantly wishing to refer but to which we have no index whatever. Only by searching for a long time through a miscellaneous mass can such records or papers be located and it seems absolutely necessary to arrange them by some system by which they may be found as upon them the titles to very much property depends.
