STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Swan's Island.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. That Swan's Island plantation in the county
2 of Hancock, and all islands, the whole or any part of which,
3 are within three miles from high water mark of said Swan's
4 Island, except Marshall's Island, and such islands as are
5 now a part of Long Island plantation, be and the same are
6 hereby incorporated into a town by the name of Swan's
7 Island, vested with all the powers and subject to all of the
8 duties, except as hereinafter provided, of other incorporated
9 towns in this state.

SECT. 2. Said town shall not be under any obligation
2 to furnish relief to any paupers, or persons needing relief,
3 found in Long Island plantation.

SECT. 3. This act shall not take effect unless the same
2 is accepted by a majority vote by ballot of the legal voters
3 of Swan's Island plantation present at the annual meeting
4 of said plantation, to be held on the first Monday of March
5 A. D. 1896, an article therefor having been inserted in
6 the warrant calling said meeting. If said act is then so
7 accepted it shall immediately take effect and the legal
8 voters there present may proceed to elect the usual town
9 officers, and transact any other business as a town, of
10 which notice has been given in the warrant calling said
11 meeting of said plantation.
