SENATE AMENDMENT "A" TO SENATE DOCUMENT No. 137.

Amend section 4 of Senate Document No. 137 by adding thereto the words: 'Provided that in case of any crossing of a railroad, unless said corporation shall agree with the company owning and operating such railroad, as to place, manner and conditions of the crossing, the railroad commissioners shall determine the place, manner and conditions of such crossing; and all work within the limits of such railroad location shall be done under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the officers of such railroad company, but at the expense of this corporation.'

So that said section as amended shall read as follows:

‘Section 4. Said company is further authorized to lay,
13 construct and maintain in, under, through, along and
14 across the highways, ways, streets, railroads and bridges
15 in said town and to take up, replace and repair all such
16 pipes, hydrants and structures, as may be necessary for
17 the purposes of its incorporation; to enter upon and exca-
18 vate any highway or other way in such manner as least to
19 obstruct the same; to enter, pass over and excavate any
20 land; to take and hold by purchase or otherwise any real
21 estate, rights of way or of water and in general to do any
22 acts necessary, convenient or proper for carrying out any
23 of the purposes of this act; provided that in case of any
24 crossing of a railroad, unless said corporation shall agree
25 with the company owning and operating such railroad, as
26 to place, manner and conditions of the crossing, the rail-
27 road commissioners shall determine the place, manner and
28 conditions of such crossing; and all work within the limits
29 of such railroad location shall be done under the supervi-
30 sion and to the satisfaction of the officers of such railroad
31 company, but at the expense of this corporation.’
