## STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Plantation of Carrying Place.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of fifty-three dollars and two cents to be paid to the 3 treasurer of said plantation of Lexington it being money 4 belonging to said plantation for school purposes for the 5 years 1890, 1891 and 1892.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The sum of \$18.68 for 1890, \$18.12 for 1891 and \$16.22 for 1892 was set apart for said plantation for school purposes and is now in the state treasury and has never been received by said plantation, as there has been no election of plantation officers in said plantation of Carrying Place since 1892, a question arises how said plantation can properly receive said sums to which it is legally and morally entitled. The books of the state treasurer show the above facts and for reasons set forth it has been thought best that said sums be paid by above resolve.
