STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to amend clause twenty-six of section six of
chapter one of the Revised Statutes, relating to Corpora-
tions.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Clause twenty-six of section six of chapter one of the
2 Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred
3 and twenty-six of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred
4 and ninety-three, is hereby amended by adding thereto
5 the words: 'The organization of any corporation which
6 may be hereafter organized under any general law of this
7 state becomes null and void within two years from the
8 day when its certificate of incorporation has been filed in
9 the office of the secretary of state, unless such corporation

10 shall have commenced actual business under its organiza-
11 tion,' so that said clause of said section, as amended, shall
12 read as follows :

‘XXVI. Acts of incorporation shall be regarded in
14 legal proceedings as public acts, and be in force of the
15 date of their approval. All acts of incorporation granted
16 since January first, eighteen hundred and ninety-three,
17 become null and void in two years from the day when the
18 same take effect, unless such corporations shall have
19 organized and commenced actual business under their
20 charters. The organization of any corporation which may
21 be hereafter organized under any general law of this state
22 becomes null and void within two years from the day
23 when its certificate of incorporation has been filed in the
24 office of the secretary of state, unless such corporation
25 shall have commenced actual business under its organiza-
26 tion.’
