IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE

AN ACT to prohibit fishing in certain tributaries of Moose

pond in Somerset county.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Fishing of all kind and every description is

2 hereby prohibited for a term of four years in certain streams

- 3 and portions of streams flowing into Moose pond lying
- 4 within the towns of Hartland and Harmony, to wit:
- 5 Higgins' stream, Corson brook, so called, which flows into
- 6 the north end of said pond and so much of Tuttle brook,
- 7 so called, as lies between its junction with said Corson
- 8 brook on the south and the northerly line of the poor farm,
- 9 so called, now or formerly owned by the town of Athens,
- 10 where it crosses said Tuttle brook.

SECT. 2. Whoever violates the provisions of this act 2 shall be fined not exceeding ten dollars for each offence and 3 one dollar additional for each fish so taken.
