STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to authorize the building of a fish weir in tide
waters between Baker Islands in the County of Hancock.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. William Herrick, his associates and assigns
2 are hereby authorized to build and maintain a fish weir
3 between the Baker islands, so called, lying southerly of
4 Swan's island in the county of Hancock, extending the same
5 twelve hundred feet from Great Baker island into tide
6 waters.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
