STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Oldpoint.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. All that part of the town of Madison lying 2 westerly of the following described line: beginning at the 3 center of the Kennebec river north of the little island, so 4 called, now owned by George Flint, and at the westerly 5 line of land now owned by B. Frank Burns; thence south-6 erly following the thread of the back river, so called, being 7 a branch of said Kennebec river running on the easterly 8 side of the little island, so called, and the Weston island, 9 so called, to the northeasterly corner of land now owned 10 and occupied by Theodore B. Weston, and being lot num-11 ber twenty-four (24) in said town of Madison; thence 12 southerly to the north line of the Plymouth claim, so

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13 called, also known as the "mile and a half strip," at the 14 southeasterly corner of lot number thirty-six (36) in said 15 town of Madison, and at the southeasterly corner of land 16 owned by Willis E. Clough; thence easterly on the north 17 line of said Plymouth claim to the northeasterly corner of 18 lot number twenty-five (25) in said town of Madison; 19 thence southerly to the north line of the town of Norridge-20 wock at the southeasterly corner of lot number thirty-one 21 (31) in said Madison, and to the southwesterly corner of lot 22 number nineteen (19) in said madison, said lot numbered 19 23 is now owned and occupied by Daniel Dickinson : together 24 with the inhabitants thereof, is hereby incorporated into a 5 separate town by the name of Oldpoint, and said town is 26 hereby invested with all the powers and privileges and 27 subject to all duties and obligations incident to other 28 towns of the state of Maine.

SECT. 2. The several inhabitants of the town of Old 2 Point shall be holden to pay all taxes that have been 3 legally assessed upon them, and the collector of taxes of 4 said town of Madison is hereby authorized to collect and 5 pay to the treasurer of said town of Madison all taxes to 6 him already committed in his warrant.

All moneys now in the hands of the treasurer of said 8 town of Madison and all sums which shall hereafter be 9 received from the taxes heretofore assessed, shall be 10 applied to the several purposes for which they were 11 raised, and the town officers of the town of Madison shall 12 have the same powers and perform the same duties as 13 they now have to perform, within the limits of the town 14 of Oldpoint until the organization of said town by the 15 choice of like town officers.

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SECT. 3. The existing liabilities of the town of Madi-2 son shall be divided as follows,—the town debt shall be 3 borne by the town of Madison comprising the territory 4 east of said line, and the town of Oldpoint comprising the 5 territory west of said line in proportion to the valuation 6 of their respective territories as taken by the assessors in 7 April, eighteen hundred and ninety-four.

All paupers now supported or aided by the town of Madi-9 son shall after the division be maintained and supported 10 by the town in whose territory they resided when they 11 became paupers.

The town of Madison shall bear all expenses for the care 13 and maintenance of all roads and bridges on the easterly 14 side of said line, and the town of Oldpoint shall in a like 15 manner bear all expenses for roads and bridges on the 16 westerly side of said line.

SECT. 4. The town property, real and personal, in-2 cluding all school property, located on the east side of 3 said line shall become the property of the town of Madi-4 son, and all such property located on the west side of said 5 line shall become the property of the town of Oldpoint.

All moneys in the hands of the treasurer, raised for the 7 support of schools, for the purchase of school books, and 8 for repairs on the school-houses, shall be divided between - 9 the town of Madison and the town of Oldpoint in propor-10 tion to the number of scholars in each of said towns 11 according to the number as they existed on the first day 12 of April, eighteen hundred and ninety-four. The school 13 fund held by the Second National Bank of Skowhegan, 14 being thirteen (13) shares of the capital stock of said 15 bank, and the income from said thirteen shares of the 16 capital stock of said bank shall be divided between the 17 town of Madison and the town of Oldpoint in proportion 18 to the number of scholars in each of said towns as they 19 existed on the first day of April, eighteen hundred and 20 ninety-four.

SECT. 5. Until a new apportionment of the state shall 2 be made, the town of Madison and the town of Oldpoint 3 shall remain in the same representative district in which 4 the town of Madison is now classed.

SECT. 6. Any justice of the peace in the county of 2 Somerset may issue his warrant to any legal voter of the 3 town of Oldpoint directing him to notify the inhabitants 4 thereof to meet at a time and place specified in said war-5 rant within said town of Oldpoint, giving at least seven 6 days notice thereof, for the choice of town officers, and to 7 transact such business as towns are authorized to do at their 8 annual and other meetings.

SECT. 7. This act shall take effect when approved.
