
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to exempt the property of incorporated Young

Men's Christian Associations from taxation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

All the property of incorporated Young Men's Christian 2 Associations in this state, whose entire income therefrom 3 is used for the purposes of religion, education, and charity, 4 and the other proper work of said associations, shall be 5 exempt from taxation.
