STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT relating to defences in actions for torts or injuries
suffered on the Lord's day.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. The provisions of chapter 124 of the
2 Revised Statutes relating to the observance of the Lord's
3 day shall not affect in any way the rights or remedy of
4 either party in any action for a tort or injury suffered on
5 that day.

SECT. 2. This act shall not apply to, or affect any
2 action now pending nor any action hereafter brought for
3 any cause which shall have arisen at the date of the approval
4 of this act.
