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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED  
AND NINETY-FIVE.

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AN ACT to incorporate the Jonesboro Agricultural Society.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. E. Whitney, Ansel L. Tupper, Sanford  
2 Burnham, Asa T. McRea, C. B. Albee, James McLain, N.  
3 S. Bowker, with their associates, are hereby created a body  
4 politic under the name Jonesboro Agricultural Society, and  
5 by that name have power to sue and be sued, prosecute  
6 and defend suits at law and equity, to have and use a com-  
7 mon seal and to make such by-laws and regulations, not  
8 inconsistent with the laws of the State, as may be deemed  
9 necessary for the management of its affairs.

SECT. 2. The officers of said society shall be a presi-  
2 dent, vice-president, treasurer, secretary, and a board of at  
3 least seven directors.

SECT. 3. Said society shall have power to purchase, 2  
2 lease or in any mode that may be lawful, acquire and hold  
3 real, personal and mixed estate in the town of Jonesboro,  
4 for the purpose of constructing and maintaining a driving  
5 park, fair grounds, and for the promotion of agriculture,  
6 stock raising, horticulture, mechanic arts, and manufactures.

SECT. 4. Said society shall have all the powers, bene-  
2 fits and privileges conferred on county and local agricul-  
3 tural societies by chapter 58 of the Revised Statutes.

SECT. 5. The first meeting of said society shall be held  
2 in the town hall in Jonesboro, and shall be called by any  
3 three persons named in this act, by publishing a notice of  
4 the time, place and object thereof in the Machias Republi-  
5 can and Machias Union, at least ten days before the date  
6 of such meeting and at said meeting the officers of said  
7 society shall be chosen.
