STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT for the protection of Fish of all kinds in Douglass, Madawaska and White ponds in Pittsfield and Palmyra.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. No fish of any kind shall be taken from
2 Douglass, Madawaska and White ponds or their tributaries
3 in the towns of Pittsfield and Palmyra for the term of five
4 years from the date of the approval of this act between the
5 first day of November each year and the first day of the
6 following May.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions
2 of this act shall be liable to a penalty of ten dollars for
3 such offence and in addition thereto be fined one dollar for
4 each fish so taken.
