

AN ACT for the protection of Fish in Southerland Pond.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. All persons are hereby prohibited from 2 taking fish of any kind from Southerland pond, so-called, 3 in the town of Webster, county of Androscoggin, for the 4 period of four years from the first day of May, in the year 5 of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

SECT. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this 2 act shall be liable to a fine of not exceeding ten dollars for 3 each offense and a further fine of one dollar for each fish 4 so taken, to be recovered on complaint before any trial 5 justice in Androscoggin county, one-half to the complainant 6 and one-half to the county of Androscoggin.
