STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians.

Resolved, That ten per cent of the shore rentals of the 2 Penobscot tribe of Indians for the years eighteen hundred 3 and ninety-five and eighteen hundred and ninety-six be taken 4 and expended for municipal purposes of said tribe, and that 5 the same be expended in the years eighteen hundred and 6 ninety-five and eighteen hundred and ninety-six under the 7 direction of the Indian agent.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The shore rentals are collected annually by the agent of the tribe and paid out under the direction of the State. This resolve carries no extra appropriation, but only authorizes the Indians to use ten per cent of the amount of the shore rentals allowed to them each year for municipal purposes. They cannot so use it unless they have special authority.
