STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to authorize the appointment of Commissioners for the Promotion of Uniformity of Legislation in the United States.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Within thirty days after the passage of this 2 act, the governor shall appoint, by and with the consent 3 of the council, three commissioners, who are hereby con-4 stituted a board of commissioners by the name and style 5 of 'Commissioners for the Promotion of Uniformity of 6 Legislation in the United States.' It shall be the duty of 7 said board to examine the subjects of marriage and 8 divorce, insolvency, the form of notarial certificates, 9 descent and distribution of property, the acknowledge-10 ment of deeds, execution and probate of wills, and other

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11 subjects; to ascertain the best means to affect an assimi-12 lation and uniformity in the laws of the states, and 13 especially to consider whether it would be wise and prac-14 ticable to join with the other states of the Union in send-15 ing representatives to a convention to draft uniform laws 16 to be submitted for the approval and adoption of the sev-17 eral states, and, if so, to act as such representatives from 18 this state and to devise and recommend such other course 19 of action as shall best accomplish the purpose of this act.

SECT. 2. No member of said board shall receive any 2 compensation for his services as commissioner, but each 3 commissioner shall be entitled to receive his actual dis-4 bursements for his expenses in performing the duties of his 5 office. In case any of the persons so appointed as above 6 will not undertake the office of this commission, or in case 7 of a vacancy on said board, such vacancy shall be filled by 8 the governor.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
