STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT in relation to State Examination and Certification of Teachers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. The state superintendent of schools shall 2 cause to be held, at such convenient times and places as 3 he may from time to time designate, public examinations 4 of candidates for the position of teacher in the public 5 schools of the state. Such examinations shall test the 6 professional as well as the scholastic abilities of the can-7 didates, and shall be conducted by such persons and in 8 such manner as he may from time to time designate. Due 9 notice of the time, place and other conditions of the 10 examinations shall be given in such public manner as he 11 may determine. SECT. 2. A certificate of qualification shall be given to 2 all candidates who pass satisfactory examinations in such 3 branches as are required by law to be taught, and who in 4 other respects fulfill the proper requirements. Such certi-5 ficate shall be either probationary or permanent, and shall 6 indicate the grade of schools for which the person named is 7 qualified to teach.

SECT. 3. A list of approved candidates shall be kept in 2 the office of the state superintendent, and copies of the 3 same with such information as may be desired shall be sent 4 to school committees, supervisors and superintendents 5 upon their request.

SECT. 4. The certificates issued under the provisions 2 of this act shall be accepted by school committees, super-3 visors and superintendents in lieu of the personal examina-4 tion required by section eighty-seven, chapter eleven of the 5 revised statutes and all amendments thereto.

SECT. 5. A sum not exceeding five hundred dollars 2 may be annually expended for the necessary and contingent 3 expenses of carrying out the provisions of this act.

SECT. 6. This act shall take effect when approved.
