STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE providing for expenses of the Board of State
Assessors in performance of their duties as required by
law.

Resolved, That the additional sum of one thousand dollars
2 be and is hereby appropriated for the year 1895, and the
3 additional sum of one thousand dollars be and is hereby
4 appropriated for the year 1896, for the use of the board of
5 state assessors or as much thereof as may be necessary to
6 pay expenses in performing the duties required of them
7 by law.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Chapter 103, 1891, establishing a board of State assessors “provides that certain expenses incurred in performance of official duties were to be paid by the State,” and there was appropriated one thousand dollars for the year 1891, and one thousand dollars for the year 1892. The legislature of 1893 imposed many additional duties upon us which made an increase in necessary expenses, but appropriated the same amount, one thousand dollars for 1893, and one thousand dollars for 1894. We have found this amount insufficient for a proper performance of our duties and have been obliged to curtail our work, and in order to fully perform the duties required of us we believe the additional amount asked for is reasonable and necessary.
