STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE making appropriation to cover deficiency for cattle killed on account of Tuberculosis for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-six.

Resolved, That the sum of seven thousand two hundred and eighty-seven dollars and thirty-three cents be appropriated to pay outstanding bills incurred by reason of the slaughter of animals infected with tuberculosis, exceeding the appropriations that have been made for that purpose.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The last legislature appropriated the sum of \$10,000 for the suppression of tuberculosis, to be expended under the direction of the Maine Cattle Commissioners. In their opinion the best interests of the farmers of Maine, and the public health, demanded a larger expenditure, and, acting under the advice of the Governor and Council, they condemned and slaughtered cattle to the amount of \$17,287.33, which would leave a deficiency of \$7,287.33.
