STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor the Town of Forest City to aid in Building one-half the Bridge between Maine and New Brunswick in Forest City.

Resolved, The sum of three hundred dollars be and is 2 hereby appropriated to aid building one-half the bridge 3 across the St. Croix river at Forest City, provided, that 4 American half of said bridge shall be built on the basis of 5 a cost of six hundred dollars. Provided further that the 6 sum of three hundred dollars or more shall be raised by 7 the town of Forest City or otherwise which together with 8 the amount herein appropriated shall be sufficient to fully 9 complete said bridge within the year 1897; said appropriation to be expended under the direction of the Governor 11 and Council.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This is an international bridge across the river between State Maine and New Brunswick at Forest City. The American half of the bridge is seventy-five feet long, twenty feet in width. The piers are fourteen feet high, and will have to be rebuilt. The province of New Brunswick appropriated money and rebuilt their half of said bridge two years ago and the American half must be rebuilt or discontinued, and the town small and poor are unable to rebuild without aid.
