STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Roads in the Indian Township, Wash-
ington county.

Resolved, The sum of seven hundred dollars be and is
2 hereby appropriated to repair roads and bridges in the
3 Indian township, Washington county, for the year 1897,
4 and seven hundred dollars for the year 1898; said appro-
5 priation to be expended under the direction of the Governor
6 and Council.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Indian township is held by the State and therefore has the roads to keep in repair. There are twelve miles of road on said township with two small bridges and one-half of the bridge over the St. Croix river at Princetown. There are a large amount of heavy teams hauling freight over this road and the land being low and flat making it expensive road to keep in repair.
