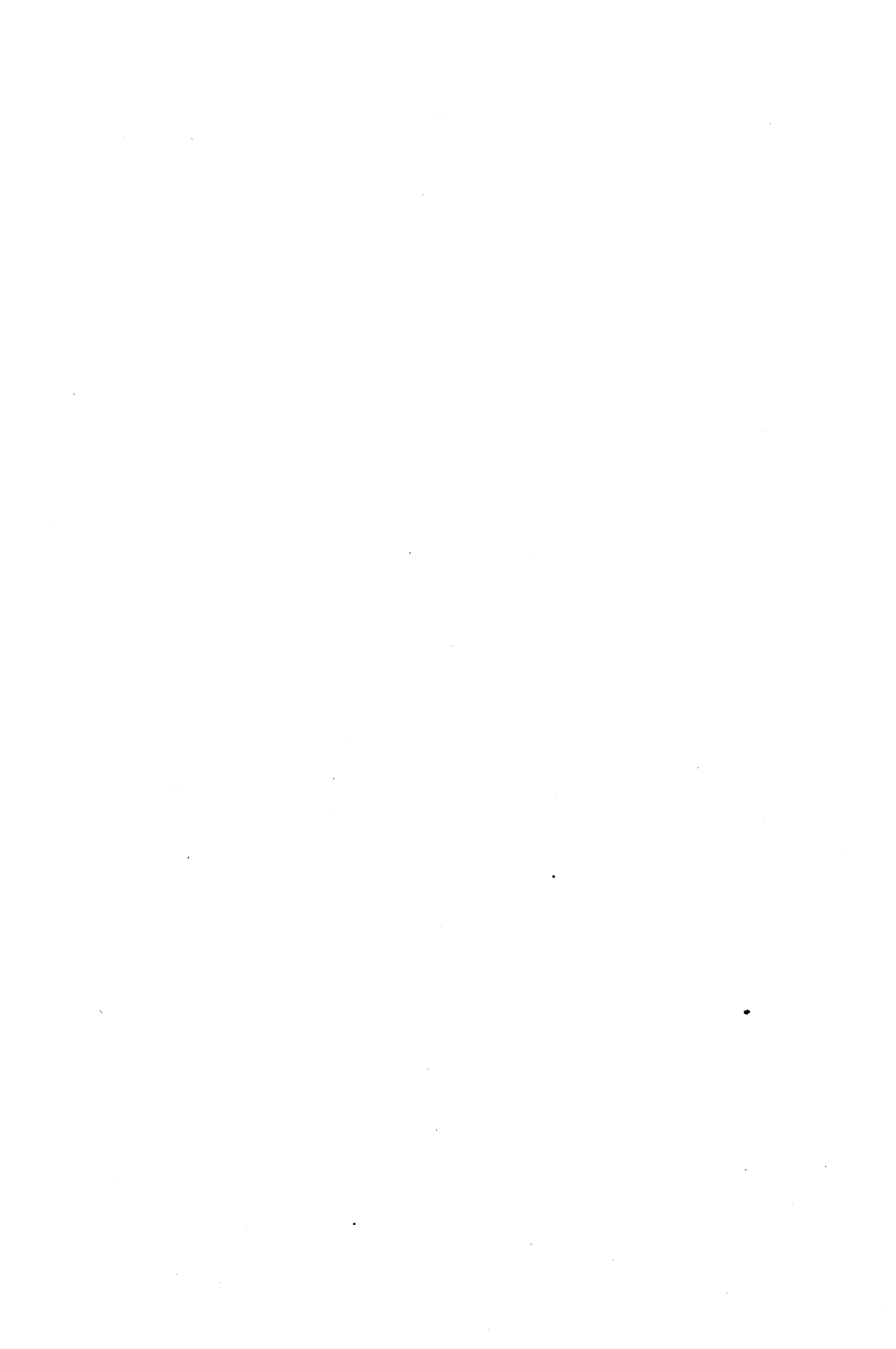

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT to create a Lien on Leather.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Whoever performs labor in any tannery where
2 leather of any kind is manufactured completely or partially,
3 whether such labor is performed directly on the hides and
4 skins or in any capacity in or about the establishment, has
5 a lien for his wages on all leather so manufactured in such
6 tannery for labor performed by him or his co-laborers for
7 thirty days after such leather is made and manufactured,
8 and until such leather is shipped on board a vessel or taken
9 in a car, which lien may be enforced by attachment within
10 that time.
