STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT to provide Funds for the Protection of the Inland
Game of the State.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Every non-resident of the State of Maine who
2 engages in the hunting or killing of moose, caribou, or deer
3 in any county in the State of Maine, shall be required to
4 pay to the State twenty-five dollars for every bull moose,
5 fifteen dollars for every caribou and five dollars for every
6 deer, shot, taken or killed by him—or had in possession in
7 open season.—Such sums shall be paid to the commis-
8 sioners of inland fisheries and game, or to persons by them
9 authorized to receive it and shall forthwith be paid into

10 the treasury of the State, and such money thus received by
11 the treasurer shall be and become a permanent fund for the
12 protection of game, the interest of which shall only be used
13 for that purpose annually. If any non-resident shall violate
14 or attempt to violate this section he shall be fined fifty dol-
15 lars and costs and said penalty shall be paid to the State
16 treasurer as a part of the permanent fund. There shall be
17 attached to every moose, caribou and deer transported
18 under the provisions of this section, a tag signed by the
19 commissioners, stating that this section has been complied
20 with.
