STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT to create a lien on spool timber and bars.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Whoever labors at cutting, hauling or sawing
2 of spool timber or in the manufacture of spool timber into
3 spool bars and the piling of such bars or at cooking for per-
4 sons engaged in such labor, has a lien thereon for the amount
5 due for his personal services and the services performed by
6 his team, which takes precedence of all other claims, and
7 continues for sixty days after such timber or spool bars
8 arrive at the place of destination for sale or manufacture, and
9 may be enforced by attachment. The court may allow and
10 apportion costs as in equity.

Sect. 2. Section forty-two of chapter ninety-one of the
2 Revised Statutes, is hereby made applicable to suits brought
3 to enforce the foregoing lien.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
