STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT to amend section 27 of chapter 81 of the Revised Statutes, relating to the recording of attachments of personal property.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section 27 of chapter 81 of the Revised Statutes 2 of Maine is hereby amended by adding thereto the words,

- 3 'provided there be an incorporated town adjoining such
- 4 unincorporated place, and if there be no such adjoining
- 5 town, such copy shall be filed and recorded in the office of
- 6 the clerk of the nearest town in the county, and if there be
- 7 two or more towns, neither of which adjoins said unincor-
- 8 porated place and at equal distances therefrom, such copy

9 shall be filed and recorded in the office of the clerk of the 10 oldest of said towns.'

So that said section shall read as follows:

'When any personal property is attached which by 13 reason of its bulk or other special cause cannot be 14 immediately removed, the officer may within five days 15 thereafter, file in the office of the clerk of the town, in which 16 the attachment is made, an attested copy of so much of his 17 return on the writ, as relates to the attachment, with the 18 value of the defendant's property which he is thereby com-19 manded to attach, the names of the parties, the date of the 20 writ, and the court to which it is returnable, and such attach-21 ment is as effectual and valid, as if the property had remained 22 in his possession and custody. The clerk shall receive the 23 copy, noting thereon the time, enter it into a suitable book, 24 and keep it on file for the inspection of those interested 25 therein, for which he is entitled to ten cents.

'When the attachment is made in an unincorporated place, 27 such copy shall be filed and recorded in the office of the clerk 28 of the oldest adjoining town, provided there be an incor-29 porated town adjoining such unincorporated place, and if 30 there be no such adjoining town, such copy shall be filed 31 and recorded, in the office of the clerk in the nearest town 32 of the county, and if there be two or more towns, neither of 33 which adjoins said unincorporated place, and at equal dis-34 tances therefrom, such copy shall be filed and recorded in 35 the office of the clerk of the oldest of said towns.'
