STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT amendatory of and additional to chapter five hundred and ninety-four of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-three, entitled "An act to incorporate the Lawry Dam Company."

Be it cnacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section two of chapter five hundred and ninety-2 four of the Private and Special Laws of 1893 is hereby 3 amended so that said section as amended shall read as fol-4 lows:

'Section 2. Said corporation is hereby empowered and 6 authorized to build and maintain a dam in the Sheepscot

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7 river in the town of Palermo, between the points where the 8 Sheepscot river emerges from Sheepscot Great Pond and 9 a point not more than a mile below following the river, and 10 to build and maintain another dam in said river in the town 11 of Somerville on the site of the old saw-mill dam at Somer-12 ville Corner, and to remove rocks and make all other neces-13 sarv improvements in said river and pond between a point 14 on said river in the town of Palermo two miles above the 15 head of Sheepscot Great Pond and the saw-mill of George 16 S. Burrill in the town of Jefferson, to facilitate the driving 17 of logs and lumber down the same and for this purpose said 18 corporation may take land and materials necessary for the 10 construction of said dams and to make said improvements. 20 And if the parties cannot agree upon the damages, the cor-21 poration shall pay the proprietors of the land and materials, 22 so taken, such damages as shall be ascertained and deter-23 mined by the county commissioners of the county in which 24 such land or material, so taken, is situated, in the same man-25 ner and under the same conditions and limitations as are by 26 law provided in the case of damage by laying out public 27 highways. If any damage is occasioned by the drawing off 28 of said water to any highways, bridges, mills or lands below 29 said dams or either of said dams and if the parties cannot 30 agree upon the damages, the corporation shall pay to the 31 parties so damaged, such sums as may be ascertained and 32 determined by the county commissioners of the county in 33 which such highways, bridges, mills or lands so damaged, 34 are situated, in the same manner and under the same condi-35 tions and limitations as are by law provided in case of dam-36 age by laying out of public highways. And for damages 37 occasioned by flowing land, and such other damages hereto-38 fore mentioned, said corporation shall not be liable to an 39 action at common law, but persons injured may have a rem-40 edy by a complaint for flowage in which the same proceed-41 ings shall be had as when a complaint is made under the 42 statute of this State for flowing lands occasioned by raising 43 a head of water for the working of mills, and the head of 44 water caused by said corporation by the maintenance of said 45 dams shall be drawn off on or before the fifteenth day of May 46 of each year.

'Provided, however, that the right to build and maintain 48 said second dam in the town of Somerville as aforesaid shall 49 not take effect, if the Maine Water and Electric Power Com-50 pany shall within two years from the approval of this act 51 build upon the aforesaid site at Somerville Corner a dam at 52 least five feet high in the manner and under the restrictions 53 of its existing charter, and said right shall so remain in 54 operation only so long as said Maine Water and Electric 55 Power Company shall so maintain said dam by it so built.'

Sect. 2. Said chapter five hundred and ninety-four of the 2 Private and Special Laws of 1893 is hereby further amended 3 by adding thereto the following section:

'Section 6. Said corporation is hereby authorized and 5 empowered to locate, build and maintain in Sheepscot river

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6 at any point or points between said saw-mill of George S. 7 Burrill in the town of Jefferson and the outlet of Long Pond 8 in the town of Windsor, piers and booms for sorting out 9 logs and lumber coming down said river and for holding the 10 same for use and manufacture at said Burrill's mill, and are 11 not to occasion any unreasonable delay or obstruction in 12 the driving of any other logs or lumber. Said corporation 13 may take such lands as may be necessary for the erection 14 and maintenance of said piers and booms and connecting 15 the same with the river shore, and may with its agents, 16 servants and teams, pass and re-pass over said shores and to 17 and from the same over the land of other persons for the 18 purposes aforesaid, and for managing said piers and booms 19 making compensation therefor as is provided in the case of 20 land taken in laying out highways.'

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
