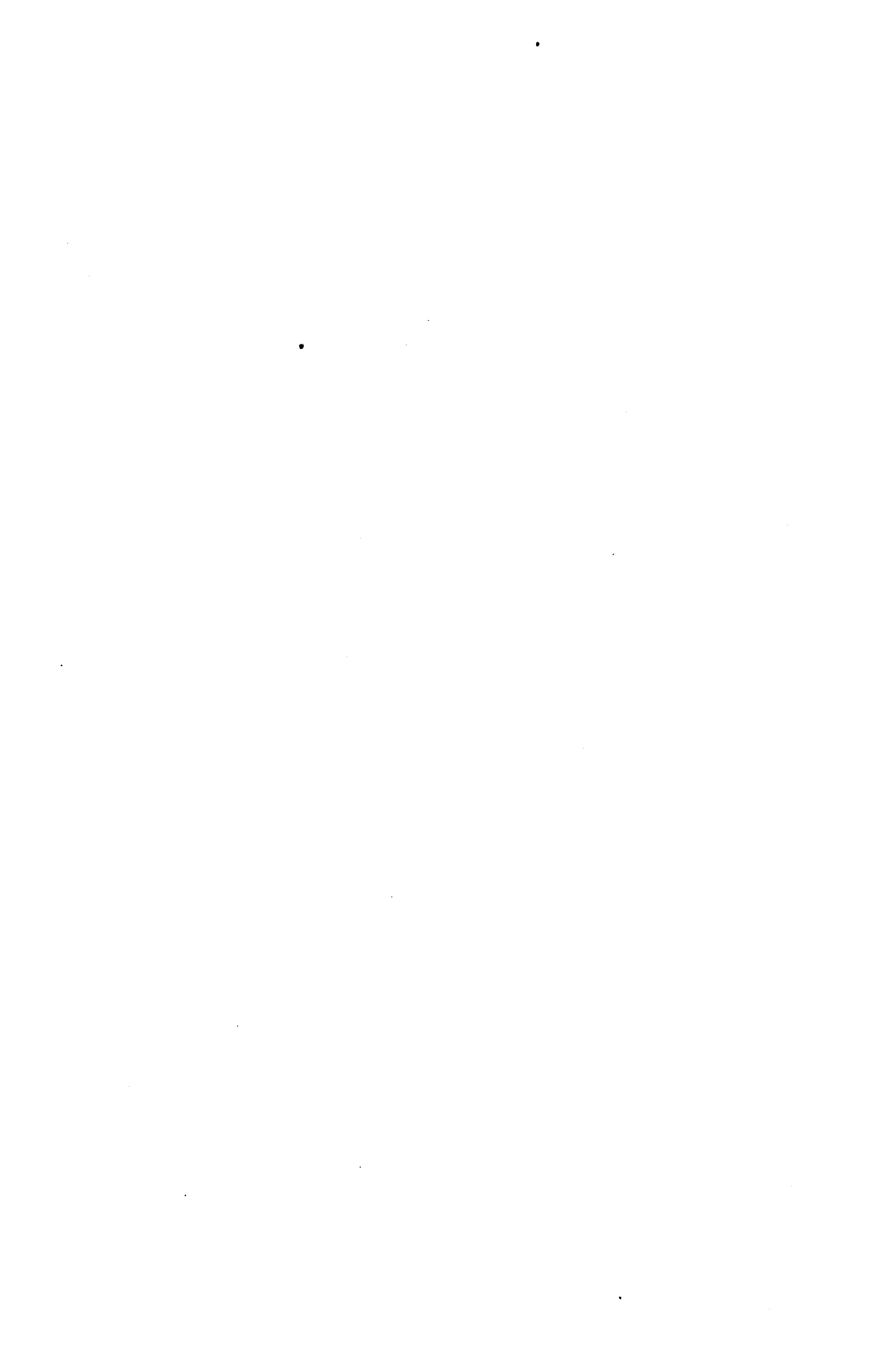

RESOLVE in favor of aid in blasting ledge in town of  
Frenchville in Aroostook county.

---

*Resolved,* That the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars  
2 be and hereby is appropriated to aid in blasting ledge in  
3 highway in town of Frenchville, to be expended under  
4 the direction of the selectmen of Frenchville.



## STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This ledge has been blown off and now the road is about fifteen feet wide, but is now very dangerous and all that ride by are in danger of their lives. The ledge is slate, and rises from 20 feet to 30 feet high and at least 60 feet up and down the river.

It is a very important road because it is the main road to Fort Kent. The cost of blasting would be at least \$500, and it would be a great burden upon the town to have to bear the whole expense of blasting.
