RESOLVE in favor of the Town of Caribou.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred and thirty-one dol-
2 lars and seven cents be and hereby is appropriated to be
3 paid to the treasurer of Caribou to reimburse said town for
4 money expended for the support of State paupers, during
5 the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

During the year 1893, the town of Caribou furnished pauper supplies to C. H. McGinness who fell into distress in Connor, a plantation adjoining Caribou.

Numerous affidavits were sent to the proper committee of the governor's council but were not pronounced satisfactory to that committee until November, 1894, at which time he was accepted as a State pauper, and the town was reimbursed for all supplies furnished during the year 1894, but the committee refused to allow for supplies furnished during the year 1893, on the ground that the appropriation was exhausted and their books closed, although the town was diligent in obtaining evidence during the entire year of 1893.
