## STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Town of Brunswick.

---

*Resolved,* That the State treasurer be and is hereby authorized and directed to pay to the town of Brunswick one thousand nine hundred eighty-one dollars and fifty-eight cents it being to refund to said town the amount paid by it for the support of State paupers at the insane hospital the same to be paid when said claim shall be allowed by the governor and council.



### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The town of Brunswick has supported at the insane hospital, at Augusta, three insane paupers, who are aliens, without pauper settlement in Maine, and residents in Brunswick. Their names, the dates of commitment to the hospital, and the amounts necessarily expended by the town for their support, are as follows:

Mariane Fournier, June 24, 1891.....	\$821 51
Joseph Cote, June 26, 1891.....	848 87
Benj. B. Sudsbury, Jr., July 25, 1895.....	311 50
Total .....	<u>\$1,981 58</u>

The Governor's Council, on satisfactory proof of these facts, voted to reimburse the town for these expenses, but the appropriation available for the purpose proved insufficient, and the town therefore applies to the legislature.
