STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-SEVEN

AN ACT to amend an act, entitled "An Act to incorporate
the Farmington Village Corporation.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Section two of chapter three hundred and
2 ninety-two of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and
3 sixty is hereby amended by adding thereto the following:

‘Section 2. Said Farmington Village Corporation at any
5 legal meeting called for that purpose may vote to pur-
6 chase the entire works and rights of the Farmington Water
7 Company, for such sum of money as may be adjudged
8 payable according to the terms of article ten of the con-
9 tract entered into between said Farmington Village Cor-

10 poration and said Farmington Water Company; or in
11 accordance with the terms of any other contract hereafter
12 entered into by the same parties. Said Farmington Vil-
13 lage Corporation shall after such vote and payment of the
14 purchase price to the said Farmington Water Company,
15 receive from said Farmington Water Company an assign-
16 ment and transfer of all the works and rights of said Farm-
17 ington Water Company and shall thereafter own and oper-
18 ate said works and exercise and enjoy the rights and fran-
19 chise of said water company as fully as if granted to it direct.'

Sect. 2. The Farmington Village Corporation is hereby
2 vested with the authority to raise such sum or sums of
3 money as are necessary for the payment of the purchase
4 price of said works or in payment of future extensions,
5 additions or improvements of the same, by assessment upon
6 the polls and property within its territory or by the issu-
7 ance of bonds of the corporation and to execute its mort-
8 gage of the above works and rights as security for their
9 payment.
